



At the station

The railway station was traditionally one of the major focal points in towns across NSW, providing a meeting point for people and facilitating freight movement around the state. The size and architecture of each station often reflected the town's prosperity, such as Albury's magnificent station (above). The architecture of railway buildings has given us a wealth of beautiful stations, which have historically reflected the growth and importance of rail in NSW. During the 1880s station buildings were often very ornate and a symbol of prosperity.
