### **RailCorp working to keep services to timetable tomorrow**

RailCorp is working to minimise any disruptions to train services caused by protected industrial action by rail unions tomorrow, Thursday 5 August.

“Rail unions have informed RailCorp the planned action tomorrow involves work stoppages at some suburban maintenance depots and two suburban office locations between 10am and 2pm,” Acting RailCorp Chief Operating Officer Tony Eid said.

“We will be running normal weekday timetable services and we’re working hard to ensure any impact on passengers is minimised.

“There may be some minor delays or changes to services on Thursday afternoon.

“We’re working to keep this to a minimum.

“I’d encourage passengers to listen for announcements or check the indicators at their station.
